

Milestone Dates

- Chemical weapons storage began in 1942
- Construction of TOCDF began in 1989
- Disposal operations began in 1996
- Complete destruction of GB nerve agent-filled munitions on March 15, 2002
- Complete destruction of VX nerve agent-filled munitions on June 3, 2005

TOCDF Update

- Decontamination and other plant changeover activities in preparation for the TOCDF Mustard Agent Destruction Campaign continue.
- In preparation for the disposal of the mustard agent-filled ton containers (TCs), TOCDF workers continue to modify two storage igloos that will be used to sample the mustard TCs. The work is nearly complete, as workers continue installation of Automatic Continuous Air Monitoring Systems. Phase 1 (of 3) systemization of facilities and equipment has begun.

TOCDF workers install a ventilation system that will circulate air into the sampling igloos then through charcoal filters. This system provides clean air for workers and sampling glove boxes.
