


## Library of Congress Web site has historic depot photographs



*Collection of 49 pictures documents what life was like for workers during igloo construction in 1941.*

For those interested in historic depot photos from the 1940s, the Library of Congress has a Web site, <http://lcweb2.loc.gov/pp/pphome.html> to look up on the Internet.

The photos were taken by photographer Russell Lee during the early days of the depot. The photos show early igloo construction, the workers who helped build the igloos, a party given by the contractor in celebration of pouring concrete for twenty-four igloos in twenty-four hours, and 1940s history of the depot and surrounding community.

There are some interesting photos, particularly one which shows workers sleeping on cots inside an igloo (shown above) and a large number of workers enjoying refreshments during the 24-hour construction record.

The Depot Public Affairs Office and the Chemical Disposal Outreach Office in Hermiston have had several historic depot photos from this time period, but only recently was information discovered by Bruce Henrickson, depot/disposal public affairs officer, that the photos existed on the Library of Congress Web site.

To locate these photos, persons entering the Web site must use the search function and type "Umatilla Ordnance Depot," the depot's original name.

## UMCDF Highlights

- It has been 334 days since a lost-time accident occurred at the UMCDF (July 7, 2006).
- Completed the month of May with 10,729 GB 155mm projectiles and 71,510 lbs. of agent processed.

Total number GB-filled 155mm projectiles processed this period	1,026
Total number GB 155mm projectiles processed to date	37,201
Total number GB projectiles processed to date	51,447
Percentage of total GB projectiles processed to date	83.5
Total munitions destroyed to date since start of operations (Sept. 8, 2004)	144,854
Total pounds of GB chemical agent destroyed this period	10,641
Nominal tons of GB chemical agent destroyed to date	980.84
Percentage of total agent tons destroyed	26.39

### UMCD/UMCDF Milestones

- **April 15, 2007:** Reached 25 percent of total agent tons destroyed.
- **Feb. 1, 2007:** Processed the first GB 155mm projectiles through the Metal Parts Furnace (MPF).
- **Jan. 25, 2007:** Began the GB 155mm projectile campaign with delivery of munitions from depot storage to the disposal facility.
- **Jan. 3, 2007:** Completed the GB 8-inch projectile campaign.
- **Nov. 6, 2006:** Processed the 100,000th munition stockpiled at Umatilla.
- **Sept. 28, 2006:** Began GB M426 8-inch projectile campaign.
- **Aug. 9, 2006:** Completed GB M55 rocket campaign.
