

### ANCA employees safely store, move agent-filled munitions

### Key Messages

- ◆ The Anniston chemical munitions stockpile is safely stored and maintained by the employees of the Anniston Chemical Activity (ANCA) under the command of Lt.Col. Willie J. Flucker.
- ◆ Disposal is safer than indefinite storage.
- ◆ Since 1990, more than 23,980 tons of chemicals and more than 2,529,500 U.S. munitions have been safely incinerated.
- ◆ The U.S. Army *IS* committed to the safety of the community, the environment, and the work force.



### *Anniston Team ending another campaign ANCDF prepares to demilitarize small projectiles*

After demilitarizing more than 15,800 mustard-filled 155mm projectiles (above), Anniston Chemical Agent Disposal Facility (ANCDF) employees have begun preparatory activities to begin processing smaller 105mm projectiles. The 105mm projectiles are almost 16 inches long and weigh about 33 pounds. Demilitarization activities will resume early next month. The first two mustard-filled ton containers have been processed. The balance of the Anniston ton containers, which hold about 170 gallons of agent, will be processed during the 105mm projectile campaign. ANCDF chemical munitions demilitarization operations are still on schedule to conclude this summer. *(Creed)*

### Anniston Milestones

- ◆ **July 2, 2009 ~ March 24, 2011:** The ANCDF team has processed **274,122** mustard-filled munitions and **153,988** mustard gallons.
- ◆ **July 23, 2006 ~ December 24, 2008:** All **219,374** VX agent munitions and **196,925** gallons of VX nerve agent are safely demilitarized by ANCDF employees.
- ◆ **August 9, 2003 ~ March 2, 2006:** All **142,428** GB munitions and **96,078** gallons of GB nerve agent safely demilitarized.
- ◆ **1997 ~ 2003:** Westinghouse Anniston constructs and tests the ANCDF.
- ◆ **1997:** U.S. ratifies Chemical Weapons Convention, an international weapons treaty.
